Aims & Outcomes

The aim of the Band Program is to provide musical enrichment through the playing of an instrument in one of the school bands. At the same time, the program aims to achieve a high- performance standard and to encourage the development of teamwork in a happy atmosphere.

By participating in the Band Program children will be able to achieve the following outcomes:

- An understanding of how to combine as a team for the best outcome
- An ability to work with children from different school years, as well as their own
- A level of proficiency in playing a musical instrument
- Confidence and self-esteem by performing in public
- An enjoyment of music
- Friendship with like-minded musicians
- Mentoring opportunities for senior students to assist with training band

Through providing the Band Program, AHPS can:

- Participate in community, both in and outside school
- Enhance its reputation in public forums across the Northern Beaches
- Enrich the school's curriculum
- Identify, foster and develop musical talent

AHPS BANDS

Allambie Heights has four bands. Membership to each band is determined by musical experience and ability, not by seniority in school years.

TRAINING BAND

- Rehearses Tuesday and Thursday mornings
- For students new to the band program and/or the specific instrument
- Made up of predominantly Year 3 students
- For members to become familiar with performing as a band, and to become competent with their new instruments in a fun and supportive environment

CONCERT BAND

- Rehearses Mondays after school and Wednesday mornings
- For students with 1-2 years experience
- All Training Band students are assessed for promotion to the Concert Band by the Band Director at the end of Term 4, and at regular intervals thereafter
- Promotion is at the discretion of the Band Director who considers the student's musical ability, commitment to the band and vacancies for specific instruments. Students who have been promoted too soon risk becoming frustrated with music beyond their capabilities, and lose interest

PERFORMANCE BAND

- Rehearses Monday mornings and Thursdays after school
- The senior band for students with 2+ years experience
- All Concert Band students are assessed for promotion to the Performance Band by the Band Director at the end of the Term 4 and at regular intervals thereafter

JAZZ BAND

- Rehearses Wednesdays after school
- Extension program for interested students who will learn pieces in the jazz genre
- For students at Performance Band level, however, students in Concert Bands can audition by invitation
- Additional fee payable



BAND DIRECTOR

Surrey Hodges



Surrey has been Band Director for AHPS Bands since 2018. And, in 2019, she set-up the AHPS Jazz Band.

Surrey's passion for music and the spirit she brings to the AHPS Band Program is exceptional. She genuinely inspires countless aspiring musicians across the Northern Beaches. She has an ability to make every rehearsal fun, which, together with the trust she shares with the students, keeps them highly enthusiastic and engaged throughout the year.

Surrey's musical journey started in Year 3 at Beacon Hill Public School, in just the same way as students in the AHPS Band Program are introduced to music.

In 2013 she completed her tertiary qualifications from the Australian Institute of Music. It was in 2013 that she started conducting and working as band director at St Kieran's Catholic Primary School.

Since 2021 in addition to conducting 4 bands at AHPS, Surrey has been the Junior Band Director for Manly Vale Public School, and the Director of both the Training Band and Intermediate Band at Curl Curl North Public School.



In 2025 Surrey is working to establish a community jazz band for her band alumni and anyone else (parents/carers welcome) keen for an opportunity to enjoy performing with a community jazz band.

Surrey continues to perform regularly, in a professional band called The Great Gatsby Orchestra conducted by Geoff Power, as well as in the Northside Big Band.

Surrey is also available to tutor students on the saxophone and clarinet.

JOINING THE BAND PROGRAM

When to Join

Membership is available to students who will be in Year 3 to Year 6.

In Term 4, information sessions and assessments are organised primarily to recruit next year's Training Band.

You are of course still welcome to contact the Band Committee at AHPSBand@gmail.com, or via the school, at any time throughout the year to enquire about joining the Band Program.

1. Band Information Evening

In Term 4 each year, an information evening is held in the school hall for parents and students in Years 2-5 to introduce the Band Program. Current band students will demonstrate all the available instruments, so you can hear the sound and style of each. Your child will be able to try every instrument in the room. It can get very noisy.

2. Submit application and shortlist

Application forms are available at the end of the Band Information Evening. They can be completed and returned to the Band Committee at the end of the evening, or later to the school office. Additional copies of the application form will also be available at the school office.

The application form will list your child's top 3 preferred instruments.

3. Instrument preferences

When discussing what 3 instruments your child would prefer, please consider the range of options available and talk to current players about these instruments. Also consider how your child will get to band for their rehearsal and bear in mind the size and weight of your chosen instrument, which will need to be brought to rehearsals and performances.

Bass instruments such as trombone and baritone are vital to the band, and a competent player of one of these instruments is a much sought after and welcome addition to any high school band.

Further information about the available instruments is available below in pages 10-12.

Shortlisting at least 3 instruments is important as a student's first preference may not be suitable/available.

4. Instrument blow test (during school hours) & instrument allocation

Our Band Director will undertake a 15 minute assessment of the suitability of your child's preferred instruments. As an experienced director and professional musician, the Band Director will identify the instrument that your child is most likely to succeed in playing, and therefore enjoy. The band is a team of 20-30 students who will need to work together.

Percussion students must undertake a series of exercises, to see if they are capable of the mental stamina for controlled repetitive rhythms in the percussion section.

5. Band placement offer of instrument

You will receive a letter of offer confirming the allocated instrument and inviting your child to join the Band Program.

Not all students are offered their preferred instrument. We try to accommodate all preferences, however, since some instruments are more popular than others, and our aim is to achieve a balanced band sound, this is not always possible. Typically, there are 8 to 10 people who request percussion as their preference, with only 2 spaces available to fill in the Training Band!

Instrumental balance is the most important aspect of a successful band.

6. Commitment to the program for 1 school year

Our expectation is that students play this instrument for at least one year.

If a student wishes to change instruments, they will need to start in the Training Band again with the new instrument for at least a term. The Band Director, before promotion to the Concert Band, will review the student. Learning a new instrument takes time and we want each student to see the reward for their effort.

7. Registering for the Band Program

To accept your child's offer, you must register your child for the Band Program.

How to register will be outlined in the letter of offer.

THEY'RE IN THE BAND! WHAT NEXT?

Students are all now musicians and important members of a band, committed to practicing their instrument, their music, rehearsing and performing together with their peers.

Lessons / Tutoring

All students in the Band Program must have weekly lessons with their instrument tutor.

Lessons should commence at least 1-2 weeks before the first band rehearsal.

Students progress quicker with private lessons from a professional instrument tutor, rather than an older sibling or student, who is not, formally, a tutor. A professional will provide a structured and comprehensive tuition, and the student will enjoy playing their instrument more.

We recommend that you attend lessons occasionally to see how the student is progressing.

Band Communications

All notifications are first communicated by the school via *Compass* on Tuesdays.

The Band Committee also coordinates *WhatsApp* groups for informal communication and reminders. These groups are particularly important at offsite performances. Please accept all invitations to join the band *WhatsApp* groups.

The Band Director and the Band Committee can also be contacted by emailing AHPSBand@gmail.com, or by emailing the school office.

Band Rehearsals

Each core band has 2 rehearsals per week. It is important that students attend every rehearsal.

Band Workshop "Band Jam"

Once a year we have an intensive workshop, "Band Jam", which is a highlight of the Band Program's calendar.

The workshop is for a whole day on a weekend day in late-Term 1 or in early-Term 2. It is extremely important that students attend as it noticeably improves skills and lifts all 3 bands ahead of their first public performances.

Instrument specific tutors attend on the day, providing intensive lessons for small groups (sections of the bands). After this, they rotate into whole band practice with the Band Director, showcasing what they have learned.

As well as music making there will be an organised activity.

It is important that all band members make a commitment to attend this most valuable day. It is a time of great musical growth and promotes teamwork, which is so important for the band. It is a lot of fun too!

Performances & Events

Bands exist to perform! Opportunities to perform are organised throughout the year, both in and out of school hours.

Generally, the bands will attend 1-2 evening/weekend performances per term. Families must get students and their instruments to/from performances, arriving 45 minutes before a performance. The furthest venues are Pittwater High and The Concourse, Chatswood.

Band Uniform



Band shirts will be handed out to new Training Band members at the Band Workshop Day. If your child needs to change size as they progress through school, please email the Band Committee at AHPSBand@gmail.com.

Attendance at Rehearsals and Performances

Non-attendance is unfair to the rest of the band and it is unfair to the Band Director.

If you cannot attend a rehearsal or performance, you must advise the Band Director.

If you will be away for an extended period of time, please advise the Band Director by emailing the Band Committee at AHPSBand@gmail.com.

Volunteer Band Assistant Roster

A band assistant is required to supervise at each rehearsal.

It is a great opportunity to observe your child's participation and progress in the band.

Duties are not onerous. It involves helping the students to set-up and pack-up, assisting the Band Director, and providing a presence to dissuade poor behaviour.

If you cannot attend your rostered rehearsal, and cannot swap with anyone, please notify the Band Committee as soon as possible at AHPSBand@gmail.com. If you arrange a swap you must notify the school of the replacement.

All volunteers must complete a digital declaration and show photo ID at the school office prior to volunteering and follow the school's sign in and sign out procedures before attending the hall for supervision

Photography

Photographs and videos are often taken of the children performing. Occasionally images will be used in publications such as *The Grapevine*, the Allambie Bands in Concert printed program, sponsorship proposals, or for promotional purposes.

Leaving the Band Program

Students entering the Band Program make a commitment to the band for that entire year.

If your child is unhappy in the band, first discuss it with the Band Director, or a member of the Band Committee, as the problem may be easily resolved.

If a student must leave the Band Program during a term, full band fees and instrument hire fees will be charged for that term.

Notify the Band Committee in writing of your intention to leave the band at AHPSBand@gmail.com.

Refund of instrument hire deposits will also be processed following receipt of a written request.

INSTRUMENTS

Instrument Hire

A limited number of instruments are available for hire from the school. Please refer to Schedule 1 for the cost of hire for the current year. An instrument bond is required and also an indemnity form must be signed.

Whilst we expect students to practice their instruments on a regular basis, school-owned instruments must not be taken interstate or overseas. If you intend to take an extended leave of absence from school, e.g. longer than normal school holidays, instruments should be returned to school for safekeeping.

Servicing of Hire Instruments

Instruments are returned to the school for servicing in the final week of Term 2 and are not returned to students until rehearsals commence in Week 1 of Term 3. Substitute instruments are not available over this period.

Damage to Hire Instruments

Students are expected to look after school instruments very carefully. Please ensure the instrument case is labelled with contact details.

The Band Committee will organise and pay for the regular, general servicing of the instrument. The Band Committee will contact you when the instrument is due to be serviced.

If the instrument you have hired from school has been damaged, for any reason apart from wear and tear, it is entirely your responsibility to have it repaired. Please liaise with the Band Committee to see if a temporary replacement instrument is available for use in the meantime. The Band Committee can also recommend which repairer to use. Repairs can be carried out by:

Purchasing Instruments

Students who have been playing their instrument for at least a year are encouraged to purchase their own instrument as it allows the school instruments to be freed up for new players. As well as leading to a greater commitment to band, they then have their own instrument to take on to High School with them.

Purchased instruments should be of superior quality and a well-known brand. Cheap, imitation clarinets and trumpets are problematic. They are made from softer metal, and therefore the keys break easily. Buy from a reputable store, such as Turramurra Music. Consult your child's music tutor before making a purchase.

Buying a second-hand instrument is another option. Good brands include Yamaha, Jupiter, and Selmer for Saxophones, Yamaha and Pearl for Flutes, Yamaha or Jupiter for Clarinet, Yamaha or Bach for Trumpet.

Insurance

All school hired instruments are **NOT** covered by the school insurance policy against loss or theft whilst on the school premises or whilst involved in a school band activity.

Unfortunately, the insurance of school owned instruments is a grey area. Since you do not own the instrument, it is not normally covered under your personal effects or home contents policy. A call to your insurer should ensure that the instrument could be covered. Privately owned instruments can be included in a personal effects policy. Alternatively, you can use any insurance company of your choice to see if they insure instruments.

FLUTE	 Weight in case: 1.5 kg Dimensions of: 40 cm x 10 cm x 7 cm This is the most compact instrument in the band. 	The flute is held to the side of the body and is the highest pitched instrument in the band.
OBOE		If students are interested in playing the oboe, they are required to start with clarinet or flute and will be assessed in 12-24 months for playing oboe.
CLARINET/BASS CLARINET	 Reeds will need to be bought separately. Weight in case: 1.7 kg Dimensions of case: 20 cm x 30 cm 	The clarinet is a woodwind instrument that uses a reed to produce the sound. Often called the 'liquorice stick' the clarinet is black in colour and produces a beautiful rich tone. Later in the program clarinet players may have the opportunity to play the bass clarinet, which is another all-important bass line instrument. Skills developed on the clarinet are easily transferred to other woodwind instruments once students become competent.
SAXOPHONE	 Reeds need to be bought separately. Alto Sax: Weight in case: 7 kg Case dimensions: 65 cm x 30 cm x 17 cm A trolley may be used to help transport the sax. 	Although made of brass, the saxophone is a woodwind instrument that uses a reed like the clarinet. Our bands use the alto saxophone and the slightly larger tenor saxophone. Both are very popular so keep other options in mind. All of the saxophones are played the same and advanced players jump from Alto to Tenor, Baritone or Soprano with ease.
TRUMPET	 Weight in case: 5 kg Dimensions of case: 50 cm x 20 cm x 14 cm 	Another popular brass instrument, the trumpet uses three valves and like all brass instruments requires the lips to 'buzz' - like blowing a raspberry! The trumpet is very versatile and is used in all styles of music - classical, rock, jazz and many more.

TROMBONE	 Weight in case: 5 kg Dimensions of case: 90 cm x 25 cm x 17 cm A trolley may be used to transport this instrument 	The trombone is well known for its unique slide, which can change pitch like no other instrument in the band. The trombone is another important part of the band's bass section, and an instrument, which can be played in Concert bands, jazz bands and orchestra, making it extremely versatile.
FRENCH HORN	 Weight in case: 7 kg Dimensions of case: 70 cm x 45 cm (at bell end) 	This is a very popular instrument that is featured in most movie soundtracks. It has a unique sound that is mellow and very beautiful and competent players of the horn are in great demand in all bands. Children with good musical ears and switched-on brains are required for this instrument.
EUPHONIUM or BARITONE	 Weight in its case: 8.8 kg A trolley can be used to transport this instrument 	The baritone is crucial to the balance of our bands as it is the lowest sounding instrument. It is similar to the tuba, but smaller. This is the instrument that started James Morrison's career. Very versatile and easy to carry, this instrument is in great demand in both primary and high school bands. Skills learned on this instrument are easily transferable to other brass instruments.
BASS GUITAR	 The school does not own any bass guitars. The child would need to bring the bass guitar to school for rehearsals, but they would be able to use the school amp. 	The Bass Guitar is an important instrument in our band. They play the low bass line along with the baritone. To assist the children in size, it is recommended that you buy a ¾ size guitar, which is much easier for small hands.
PERCUSSION	Bring own drumsticks to school Students must purchase a drum kit for home use	Contrary to popular opinion there is much more to percussion than just playing the drum kit. Percussionists will play bass drum, snare drum, cymbals, timpani, tambourine, whistles, bongos and many more. The percussionists take it in turns so everyone gets to play the drum kit. They will need a practice pad at home and bring their own drumsticks to rehearsals. Tuned percussion instruments are those that have pitch variation and include glockenspiel, xylophone and timpani. Tuned percussionists are often called to help with auxiliary and special effect percussion.
